The Gender/GBV Analyst draws special attention to the gender and human rights perspective of reproductive health in order to demonstrate how the cultural practice of female genital mutilation (FGM) reflects a deep-rooted inequality between the sexes, constituting an extreme form of discrimination against women.

Under overall guidance of the Representative and direct supervision of the Assistant Representative, the Gender/Gender Based Violence Analyst will lead gender programming in the country programme. S/he will provide technical leadership, and contribute to advocacy in gender and sexual Gender Based Violence response.

S/he will work on strengthening of capacity of the Gender machinery to better coordinate Gender and GBV interventions including FGM activities.

UNFPA's new strategic plan (2018-2021), focuses on three transformative results: to end preventable maternal deaths; end unmet need for family planning; and end gender-based violence and harmful practices.
