Purpose of consultancy:	The Gambian Government has a strong stand of "no women should suffer or die of obstetrir fistula" and has been discharging various efforts. However, up-to-date data are very limited of the magnitude of obstetric fistula although the 2020 situational analysis identified about 35 1025 women affected by obstetric fistula. Access to fistula repair surgery in The Gambia is low and unevenly distributed across the country. Only three facilities out of the many facilities are offering fistula repair services (Edward Francis Small Teaching Hospital, Sharab Medica Centre, and Bafrow Medical Centre), of which two are private, and one is public. Additionally all 3 facilities are in the urban area, which limits the access of those living in rural areas. This suggests the need to strengthen the public fistula treatment center (EFSTH) with functional theaters, an increased number of trained obstetric specialists and care nurses.
	The MOH in collaboration with UNFPA and other partners has set a target of eliminating obstetric fistulas by 2030. Thus, the prevalence study will go a long way in identifying the fistule burden.
